



## WINDOWS #708 & 709

Installed July 28,  
2010.

On the south side of the church, two new pairs of new windows are dedicated to the Glory of God and in loving memory of Lorne Robert

Harris and Alexander Gordon Moffoot. The pre-existing pair of windows featuring Christ with St. Andrew and St. Peter was relocated to the center of the bank of six windows and the new windows flank these on both sides. Four new smaller panels were also created for above each new pair of windows and in a style in keeping with the four above the original windows. A total of twelve small panels now present symbols with a long history in the Christian faith.

IHS: an abbreviation for "IHSUS," the name of Jesus in Greek.

Thistle: prickly like thorns, the thistle is symbolic of the Passion of Christ and the crown of thorns placed on His head. It is also the national flower of Scotland where St. Andrew is the patron saint.

Lantern: represents the manifest presence of God as the Light of the World.
